### Hiding Jesus

In the funeral home where I work are items used in Catholic services. There is a kneeling altar, torch lamps, and a crucifix. We actually keep a room set up for such services. Recently that area was used for a Protestant family so the items needed to be removed. I quickly found a place for the altar and the lights, but what do I do with the crucifix? This crucifix is a simple but beautiful piece made out of metal and wood. It stands over seven feet tall, and the cross part with Jesus crucified measures about two feet in length. I tried putting it in the cove of the chapel but wondered how it would look to those attending a service. Imagine Jesus, hanging on a cross, looking at them from the shadows near the piano, and some kid hollering, "What is that?!" So, I thought about the mechanical room instead. I could put him near the boiler and the cleaning supplies, but that didn't seem right. Then there was the storage closet in the back hallway. I could put him where we keep the wheelchairs figuring that Jesus did heal the sick, but that didn't seem right either. Then I stopped and asked myself why I was so concerned about where to store a crucifix. Ouakers don't have to do this very often. It was just a religious relic that had no significance to me personally, but did it? Subconsciously, for that moment, it had become significant. I began to feel like I was trying to hide Jesus. I did not want that metal Jesus to make others uncomfortable, but I did not want to stand him up near ladders and mop buckets either. It seems silly, but I was wondering how I could keep Jesus out of sight, and still honor him, and I couldn't.

Are there times in our lives when we hide Jesus to others? We don't want them to feel uncomfortable and we don't want to feel awkward ourselves, and yet we still want to believe we are honoring him? How do we become more confident and consistent in exposing Christ naturally to others?

When Paul was standing before King Agrippa in Acts 26, he gave his testimony. He spoke of how he met the Resurrected Christ on the Damascus Road. Listen to some samples of his powerful witness: "... God has helped me to this very day; so I stand here and testify to small and great alike...I am not insane, what I am saying is true and reasonable....I am sure that none of this has escaped notice, because it was not done in a corner." V.23-26

Consider four reasons we glean from Paul that should give us courage when we are tempted to hide our faith from others: First, Paul speaks of how God has helped him. God's goodness and mercy poured out on us should give us incentive to let Christ shine without hesitation or apology. Second, Paul testifies to "small and great alike". No person is of greater importance than another in God's eyes, and all stand in equal need of Christ. A man's status in the eyes of other men should not cause us to hide our faith in Jesus Christ. Third, the accusation of insanity toward Paul is refuted with a claim that the Gospel is true and reasonable. A Biblical worldview gives the best explanation for the "how" and "why" of our existence. Finally, the work of God has not been done in a corner. The Psalmist says that the heavens declare the glory of God. It takes more faith to not believe in God than to believe in him. From Creation to Christmas, from the Exodus to Easter, God's work of Redemption in the world has not been done incognito; the effects are visible to the smallest of faith.

You know, where that crucifix ended up was not that important, but the parable it became to me was priceless. I never want to be a secret disciple who hides my glorious Savior in the closet of some private religion. He is alive, and so are all those who believe in him. Remember, we can't honor Jesus and try to hide him at the same time.




### Restarting Sunday School


### **EDITORS NOTE:**




