Taking Off the Headphones

"Do your part to live in peace with everyone, as much as possible"

Romans 12:18 (NLT)

Interesting things can happen on a five-hour plane trip. Such was the case for me years ago on a flight from Portland. There was a young fella who looked to be in his late twenties in the window seat on my row. Soon a woman in her forties joined us and began to nestle into that middle seat. I try to suppress first impressions, but sometimes they are overwhelming. The young man seemed forceful and overconfident in his speech and mannerisms, the woman seemed a bit self-focused and indifferent, but we all settled down, and the plane took off.

At one point in the flight, I thought I heard the guy chewing something. It sounded like gum, candy, or maybe a piece of old tire retread. I am not sure what it was, but whatever it was, he was working it over. Obviously the woman heard it well, and it was getting to her. A little later in the flight, having all she could stand, the woman looked at the guy and said, "Your chewing is so loud and obnoxious. You sound like an animal." At first he seemed shocked, but then he expressed how offended he was that she would confront him on such a trivial issue. He then proceeded to take his gum out of his mouth and show it to her. He asked if she would be more offended if he twirled it on his finger. Well! At that point, the fight was on. For several minutes the two threw barbs at one another, until it got ugly. The woman finally said, "Your mother did a rotten job of raising you!" to which the guy replied, "I have these headphones here that drown out sound. I can see your lips moving but I can't hear your voice. I bet your husband would love a pair of these!"

I contemplated what I should do. I could offer to sit between them, but if I am to die a martyr for Jesus, I was at least hoping it would not be from such an insignificant event. I also thought about reading the Bible....out loud. Maybe a passage from Leviticus about stoning would be good. Seriously, I thought that maybe a peaceful word would help the situation, before the Secret Service agent on board thought we were creating a diversion for a terrorist plot, but none of that was possible. The young man put on his headphones and tuned out, then the lady asked the stewardess for some headphones so that she could tune him out, but not until she told the stewardess how rude he was. For the next two hours they sat in silence, walled off from each other and the conflict between them, waiting to land and get away from it all....while I was quietly thanking God that I had an aisle seat.

This is symbolic of how relational conflict can be handled, or should I say *not* handled. We all face conflict in our lives. It may be with a coworker or neighbor, or in the home with a spouse, parent, or child. One of the easiest responses to conflict is to shut out the other person and the problem. Psychologists call it the "fight or flight" syndrome. This means that in a conflict, a person has the tendency to fight the other person or to avoid them completely. It is interesting that these two in the plane were practicing "flight" <u>on</u> a flight.

In most conflicts, we have three options. The first option is to "tune it up", which is another way of saying we get loud, or angry, or forceful. I have done that, and always lived to regret it. Can you relate? The second option is to "tune out", which is when we cut the person off through avoidance or the silent treatment. When we do this we are curling up in the cocoon of self-protection while still spewing out voiceless venom. Silence may be needed in a heated moment, but this silence is not productive because it is rooted in revenge. There is a third option. We can "tune in". We can tune in on several levels in the midst of the disagreement. One area we can tune into is our own emotions. We can ask, "Why am I so mad? Is it because I have been mistreated or do I just want to get my way?" Such honest self-assessment is priceless during conflict, and often just as rare. The second area I can tune into is the other person. I must ask, "Have I really heard this person?" "Is there truth in their comments, even if it is buried under a lot of emotion and immaturity?" Finally, and most importantly, we can tune into the Holy Spirit. The Lord will help us understand the conflict from His perspective and give us the grace to act and react with a Christ-like spirit.

So, our lesson for better relationships is not to go through life with headphones on. When conflict happens we should try to tune in to the other person before seeing them as an adversary. Pay attention to your deeper motives, listen to the other person's perspective, and draw on the Holy Spirit's wisdom.

Oh, there is one more lesson for better relationships....don't chew so loud.



For Our Present Days of Fear and Anger...?

None Shall Make Them Afraid

1775 - Friends had gathered for Meeting of Worship in Easton Township in New York's Washington County. Two Friends had walked 30 miles through the wilderness to join them. One of them rose to speak. "I feel led to encourage you and to bring you two words from the Lord," he said. "The Beloved of the Lord shall dwell in safety by Him. And He shall cover thee with His feathers all the day long." When he sat down, members settled into quiet worship and waiting on the Lord.



Suddenly, a shadow filled the door. A party of Indians surrounded the Meeting House. The Indian, after looking in, withdrew and beckoned with his hand. A Friend went out and was asked by signs whether there were soldiers there, the Indian shook hands with him and the rest came into the house; they were marked, painted and equipt for War. No one on the benches moved. No word was spoken, but in silence two powers were measured against one another – the power of hate and fear and the power of love. The arrows were noiselessly replaced in their quivers, and the bows laid against the wall. The meeting continued. Soon the Indians recognized what is going on: in silence the settlers have approached the Great Spirit. When the time was finished, the two Friends at the head of the meeting shook hands solemnly. By signs, the Indians were invited to join Friends for a meal and when they departed, an Indian took a white feather from one of his arrows and placed it firmly on the house in a peculiar way. "Indian, you, friends."

Notes are from *Fierce Feathers* Friends United Meeting materials and minutes of Easton Friends Meeting. *It is said that a feather was also placed over the door at homes of Friends; they were never harmed by the Indians.*

The painting was done by James Doyle Penrose in 1918, a well-educated and gifted artist who was also of the Quaker Faith. The title is taken from scripture, Micah 4:4 although the picture (Painting) takes its subject from an actual event in Quaker history in New York in 1775.

But they shall sit every man under his vine and under his fig tree; and none shall make *them* afraid; for the mouth of the Lord of hosts has spoken it. Micah 4:4
