I Will Not Be Won In A Day

Life in the Yukon valley a century ago was anything but easy. The treacherous conditions and rugged terrain of the Yukon and southern Alaska made searching for wealth a dangerous endeavor. Yet this was a place of treasure, the treasure of gold. There is a poem by Robert Service about this called "The Law of the Yukon", and the picture it paints about the challenge of experiencing the treasure of something precious speaks to me at this time in our church's life. Here is a segment of that poem:

Send not your foolish and feeble; send me your strong and your sane.

Strong for the red rage of battle, sane for I harry them sore.

Send me men girt for the combat, men who are grit to the core.

And I wait for the men who will win me – and I will not be won in a day.

And I will not be won by weaklings, subtle and suave and mild,
But by men with the hearts of Vikings and the simple faith of a child,
Desperate, strong, and resistless, unthrottled by fear or defeat,
Them will I gild with my treasure; them will I glut with my meat.

The old prospectors who braved the Yukon and were successful were people of resolve and determination...they were tough. For if the Yukon could speak with a human voice it would say, "I will not be won in a day." The hope that gold lay within its bosom kept a special breed of men on the difficult trail of discovery.

I find a simple but very profound parallel with the words of Service's poem and the task that lay before Deep Creek. Our commitment to point 3 people to Christ in 2023 is a definite challenge for us as a Christian family, and it will not be accomplished quickly and with ease. You have probably found that out by now if you attempted to reach out for Christ during our "2 in 22" year. Skepticm and indifference abound. It is hard to even point a conversation in the direction of Jesus. So what do we do? We can be steadfast.

Now we all know we are dependent on the Holy Spirit to accomplish God's work. We all know that it is "not by might, nor by power, but by my Spirit, says the Lord Almighty." (Zech. 4:6) Seeing people come to Christ, witnessing believers revived and empowered, observing broken communities touched by the love of God is a wonderful vision that he can do through us...but that usually does not happen quickly. Lives will be changed by God's power channeled through the gritty fortitude and dogged faith of the committed. Through believers who keep praying, who keep expressing love, who keep pointing people to Jesus through words and deeds.

Gold was not found in the Yukon by the indifferent and uncommitted but by "men with the hearts of Vikings and the simple faith of a child" The gold we seek is not that which is prized by the jeweler but that which proves to be infinitely more valuable, both now and in eternity. The men and women of Deep Creek our Lord will use to accomplish this will have a perceptive discernment and persistent obedience when in the presence of those God has chosen for us to reach. Those we seek for Christ will not be won in a day, but they can be won by Christ as we let him use us day by day, and minute by minute.

THOUGHT for February

I have told my boys, virtually every day of their lives, that I love them, either spoken or by text. In spite of this, when my oldest child was about 6 or 7 years old, he looked at me one day with tears in his eyes and asked "Mommy, do you like me?" I do not remember the circumstance, except that I know he was not being punished for anything. Perhaps I was having a rough day and my actions were not very loving. Perhaps I had a stern look on my face when I looked at him, or was short with him. I do not remember. I do know that those words still haunt me from time to time even though he is now a 28 year old man. I can still hear his little boy voice asking me that, and I can still see his little hurt face. To think that, for even one moment, my actions would make one of my children doubt that I even liked him cuts deep. Shame on me.

Saying "I love You" is easy; acting like it, maybe not so much. However, words without actions are just empty and meaningless. "Actions speak louder than words" is an old phrase, but a true one. We, as Christians, talk about love. We cannot forget to show it. The Bible says "By this, everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another (John 13:35)." It does not leave this to our own interpretation: It says "Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres (1 Corinthians 13:4-7)." My prayer is that my actions will not speak louder than my words and cause someone to doubt my love. I am supposed to **show** love, not just talk about it.

"Jesus replied: "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments (Matthew 22: 37-40)."

President Dwight D. "Ike" Eisenhower proposed to his wife, Mary Geneva "Mamie" Doud on Valentine's Day.

"Mamie" had many suitors, but she began courting "Ike" in 1915. They were introduced while the Douds were visiting a friend. He broke convention by inviting her to tour the facility, where he was working, with him while he made his rounds. She was immediately infatuated with him, but she initially turned him down when he asked her on a date. He pursued her for the following month as she courted other suitors before they began to date exclusively, and they were engaged on the following Valentine's Day in 1916. Ike had initially given her a miniature of his West Point class ring as was custom. On her request, he later gave her a full size ring, and he formally asked permission to marry her on Saint Patrick's Day. Mamie would go on to celebrate both Valentine's Day and Saint Patrick's Day as the anniversary of their engagement. Mamie's father agreed to the marriage and they were married July 1, 1916 at the Doud family home.
