

Mentors I've Never Met

With the death of Tim Keller, one of my mentors I never met, I am reminded of others, who, through the decades deposited seeds of truth into my mind and my spirit. Let me share a few of the quotes of great Christians whom God has used to draw me to Him throughout the years. Slowly savor these anointed words and see if any of them resonate with you spiritually as well.

God whispers to us in our pleasures, speaks to us in our consciences, but shouts in our pains. It is his megaphone to rouse a deaf world. C.S.Lewis (1898-1963) This often-used quote by Lewis can be proven by experience as we find a deeper appreciation and yearning for God when we go through suffering.

A frightened world needs a fearless church. A.W.Tozer (1897-1963) Tozer was always getting right to the point when it came to the mission and life of the Christian and the church. His challenges made me think.

There is a way of ordering our mental life on more than one level at once. On one level we can be thinking, discussing, seeing, calculating, meeting all the demands of external affairs, but deep within, behind the scenes at a profounder level we may also be in prayer and adoration, song and worship and a gentle receptiveness to divine breathings. Thomas Kelly (1893-1941) This Quaker helped me understand Christian "centering". That we could live on two levels at once. Not limiting what is sacred to Sundays but being in worship all the time.

Here is a truth you must never forget: God is more interested...in the person you are becoming than in your work, your ministry, or your job. Dallas Willard (1935-2013) Willard often emphasized that the work of the Kingdom of God is nothing less than our total transformation.

You have made us for Yourself, and our heart is restless until it rests in You. Augustine (354-430) This quote has had an almost haunting grip for me. It helps us understand that our unsettled longings can only be filled by God.

I expect to pass through life but once. If therefore, there can be any kindness I can show, or any good thing I can do to any fellow being, let me do it now, and not defer or neglect it, as I shall not pass this way again. William Penn (1644-1718) Penn was probably the most famous Quaker. He gives us pause as to how we spend every fleeting moment of this life.

"Let him who cannot be alone beware of community...Let him who is not in community beware of being alone. Dietrich Bonhoeffer (1906-1945) This German pastor and martyr has given me deep spiritual insight into our relationships. He exposes our tendency to manipulate even those we love, unless we go through Christ to one another.

To talk with God, no breath is lost. Talk on! To walk with God no strength is lost. Walk on! To wait on God, no time is lost. Wait on! E.Stanley Jones (1884-1973) Jones, a Methodist missionary to India, had great insight into prayer. His writings were priceless to me as a new Christian.

One way to define spiritual life is getting so tired and fed up with yourself you go on to something better, which is following Jesus. Eugene Peterson (1932-2018) Peterson always had a way of putting a mirror in front of the self in a way you could not argue with.

The gospel is this: we are more sinful and flawed in ourselves than we ever dared believe, yet at the very same time we are more loved and accepted in Jesus Christ than we ever dared hope. Tim Keller (1950-2023) This has been a guiding thought in my own life, reminding me of the humbling miracle of God's grace.

Friends, we should read the works and retain the quotes of great Christians, not to look clever in a crowd, but to become spiritually deep. Try it this summer. Read! Resist the superficiality of this age. Read something that is rooted in the eternal and has stood the test of time. I warn you that this will not be easy reading. It is not shallow fluff, but real nourishment that will stick to the ribs of your soul.







BRYAN ALEXANDER MORRISON




