

Headlights

A while back I was driving on a two-lane road late in the evening. In the distance I spotted an approaching car whose driver blinked his lights. My lights were on low, not high beam, so I blinked them back. I was signaling that I was a courteous driver, but immediately the driver blinked me back. A little curious, and just a tinge frustrated, I flashed my headlights again, reaffirming my commitment to safety and respect. The response again was quick. This time they clicked on their high beams and left them on. I wondered why a person would be so insensitive as to respond to my respectful action with such an inconsiderate reaction. I found myself pondering what kind of person was behind the wheel of that car. As I moved my eyes away from their approaching lights to look for the white line on the shoulder of the road, I glanced at the speedometer. There I noticed a blue light glaring near the gauges. It was the high beam light. My high beams had been on the entire twenty seconds it took this experience to unfold. I realized that I had made a mistake. That every time I thought I was blinking my lights to show courtesy, I was actually conveying intentional irritation. As the car raced to meet me I found myself, almost involuntarily, trying to explain what happened. "I thought my low beams were on. Sorry. I didn't know that my bright lights were shining in your face." As the other car came near and passed me, I was apologizing. Then I realized that there was no way to explain. How do you apologize to someone you meet at forty-five miles an hour when you cannot see them, and they cannot see you?

I wondered what the other driver was thinking. Did he or she assume that I was a cold, heartless person who liked to scare children, was mean to cats, never said "thank you", and always tried to blind other drivers? I probably seemed to be just another rogue high beamer who targets innocent motorists on a mission of misery. With my unintended victim long gone from my rearview mirror, and pondering the implications of my mistake, I noticed that the blue light near my speedometer was *still* on. The entire time that I was apologizing to the approaching driver, my bright lights were *still* glaring in his face.

Each day we encounter people who seem irritable and insensitive. Their personalities come across as glaring and uncooperative, but the headlight incident reminds me of something. The other driver could not see me through the windshield of my car, it was too dark. They didn't know that I was trying to correct the problem that was causing them discomfort, but the more I tried, the worse it got. They didn't know my intentions. All they had to go on was the apparent evidence that I was intentionally trying to ruin their evening.

The real motives of others we encounter are often mysteriously concealed within their inner world. We never know what a person has experienced that has fed their disposition. We don't know what burden is invading their mind when they are in our presence. We are unaware of the load they carry.

Steven Covey tells the story of being on a subway when a father with two young children got on board. The children were unruly and loud, and the father sat seemingly unconcerned about their behavior. After a while, with the chaos still unfolding, Covey politely mentioned to the man that the children might be disturbing others. The father looked at Covey with a bit of sheepish embarrassment and said, "*I'm sorry*. *We just left the hospital where their mother just died. I guess they just don't know how to handle it, and frankly, I don't know how to handle it either.*" Covey then tells how his whole perspective of the situation changed, and how he then tried to help the father.

Until we see behind the windshield of the glaring behavior of others, we may not know the source of their actions. Could we be more sensitive to the possible reasons a person's behavior seems a bit harsh? Maybe that will cause us to delay our impulse to tell them off or get the last word. Proverbs 11:12 states: "A man who lacks judgment derides his neighbor, but a man of understanding holds his tongue" and James tells us to "be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry" (1:10).

In a day filled with people who are stressed and anxious we may encounter more aggression and abrasiveness than normal. We may face the high beams of someone else's internal frustration and pressure. In these moments, maybe we could try to err more on the side of grace instead of rebuke. Maybe we could be more like our Master who taught about "turning the other cheek" and hailed the peacemakers as "blessed". Maybe we could hold our tongue and exercise the same discipline and grace our Lord extends to us every day.






