A Listening Life

My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, James 1:19

Two guys were on a golf course talking about the problems in their love life. The more they talked the more fired up they became about women in general, and how hard they are to understand. In an instant of perceived clarity one guy blurted out, "Yeah, My wife yelled at me yesterday saying, "You weren't even listening just now, were you?!" I thought, "Man, what a weird way to start a conversation."

Listening is not easy, and like that poor fellow, we may not even know how bad we are at it. Yet, the degree to which we are able to listen to others dramatically affects the quality of our relationships and alleviates many unnecessary misunderstandings.

As Christians, we are taught that one of the ways we learn to listen better to others is to begin listening more to God. Listening is essential to our relationship with God, and our intimacy with Him increases when we hear Him through the Bible and the Holy Spirit's promptings. As we listen to God, we become more effective in ministry to others because we begin to understand His heart for us and begin to have His heart for them. This makes active listening to others a more natural activity. It actually can become a personal trait and a lifestyle.

Some of the most powerful instruction about this subject comes from a short line in the Book of James. James says that listening should be "quick". It should be the first thing we do when encountering another person. Listening should be our first response. Our minds and spirits should be primed consistently to listen. When that happens, our ears can outrun our tongue and our temper, and conflict can often be avoided. Dr. Gary Chapman puts it this way, "When people respond too quickly, they often respond to the wrong issue. Listening helps us focus on the heart of the conflict. When we listen, understand, and respect each other's ideas, we can then find a solution in which both of us are winners."

There is so much we miss in life if we don't learn to listen deeply. Sometimes our listening gets especially rusty with those we have been around the longest. Active listening can get harder when we know the other person well, and yet listening is what is needed the most. To quote Chapman again, "Learning to listen may be as difficult as learning a different language, but learn we must, if we want to communicate love." One of the greatest gifts we can give another person is to actively listen to them. To be fully present with genuine care and interest is a form of validation that is rare in today's noise.

But listening should not be seen as just a clever trick to have a smoother life. It is part of our calling. Note here the words of Dietrich Bonhoeffer: "Christians have forgotten that the ministry of listening has been committed to them by Him who is Himself the great listener and whose work they should share. We should listen with the ears of God that we may speak the Word of God."

When officiating the funeral of someone I have never met, I often ask family and friends to give me a word or phrase that describes their loved one best. I often hear words like "hard worker", "good mother", or "faithful friend". I hope it can be said of me, "He was a good listener". If that is true of us, then we can be sure we lived our lives in a way that brought hope and healing wherever we went, and to whoever we met.

BUT

The conjunction “but” means “on the contrary,” and is used to indicate contrast or opposition between elements in a sentence. It, more or less, negates the beginning of the sentence. “I would like to be thin, but I like to eat” indicates that I probably will continue to struggle with my weight. “I like to fish, but I will not put bait on a hook” should leave you doubting that we will have a fish fry anytime soon. “But” is a strong small word. It can change everything. “We want you to be a part of our meeting, but you need to change your ways”; “We love all people, but they are not like us”; “We want our church to grow, but we do not want anything to change” are words that are, unfortunately, not too uncommon. Outside people simply hear “You need to change your ways”, “You are not like us”, and “We do not want anything to change”. We cannot rely on our children to grow up, have children, and single handedly populate our meetings. We need to attract new people in order to grow the kingdom. God has mandated it. But, to do that, we may need to truly mean “We want you to be a part of our meeting”, “We love all people”, and “We want to grow”. Think what could be possible if we truly meant those things, and if “but” was not added. If we are going to use “but”, perhaps it should be in this context:

And now these three remain: faith, hope and love.

But the greatest of these is love. 1 Corinthians 13:13

Eastern N.C. Disaster Relief September 24th - 29th, 2023 *New Bern, North Carolina*

This September trip to New Bern will be a special trip. We will be rebuilding a house for a couple who has had to endure multiple tragedies. They lost the roof of their house during hurricane Florence and they did not have any homeowners insurance. The home owner fell and broke his back while trying to do the repairs himself. Another disaster relief organization was able to repair the roof. Tragedy struck again in June 2023 when their house was destroyed by fire and the homeowner received third degree burns. He had to be sent to the UNC burn center in Chapel Hill. Now they are homeless. The Craven County Disaster Recovery and the Baptist on Missions have asked us to help. This September trip will truly change these people's lives forever.

As we have done in the past we will be working with the Baptists On Missions Disaster Group. We will be staying at their New Bern Rebuild Center. The accommodations will be dormitory style with women in one area and men in the other. If you would like to participate, please contact one of the Co-Coordiators listed above as soon as possible.
