Bearing Fruit

Becoming the Person God Made You To Be

"I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15:5 ESV) "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law." (Galatians 5:22-23 NIV)

Spring is here! The Shore barley field is growing strong. I'm already thinking about the Smith corn crop, and I'm looking for those tomato plants to appear on the Hutchin's land! You can't help but anticipate the harvest that is coming!

The cycle of the seasons is a reminder of God's faithfulness, but it is also a prompt to remember what God reveals in his Word. Jesus told his disciples that if they "abided" in him that there would be a harvest. He said they would "bear much fruit". Paul then explains what some of that fruit looks like when he listed the fruit of the Spirit in his letter to the Galatians: "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." Our life with Christ is meant to bear fruit. That fruit is the result of the Father changing us, through the Holy Spirit, to become more like Jesus Christ. In other words, we start to become the people God intended for us to be.

There are two things we need to understand about this fruit bearing life we are being drawn to. First, we can't make it happen. The late pastor and author Stuart Briscoe told a story of a friend who often used an old fruit tree to escape from his second-story bedroom window, especially when his father was about to punish him. One day the father announced that he was going to cut down the old tree because it had not borne fruit in many years. That night the boy and his friends purchased a bushel of apples and in the cover of darkness tied fruit to the unproductive branches. The next morning the father shouted to his wife, "Mary, I can't believe my eyes. The old fruit tree that was barren for years is covered with apples. It's a miracle because it's a pear tree!" The Fruit of the Spirit does not come by just trying harder, and it can't be faked like apples on a pear tree. It comes from abiding deeper in Jesus. Through prayer, scripture, worship, and community we begin to look more like the One we are in fellowship with. That is when the fruit starts to show.

Secondly, the fruit becomes visible but is gradual in its appearing. An example of this truth could be seen in the life of the famous golfer Payne Stewart. Before his life was tragically taken in a plane crash in 1999, Stewart had started a real winning trend. He had just won the 1999 U.S.Open and was key to a Ryder Cup victory. But it was the change in his demeanor that had begun to be noticed by those around him. Known as temperamental and often aloof to his fans and the press, he had begun to change. Stewart's pastor, J.B.Collingsworth said that "it almost crept up on him". This pastor knew that Stewart had made a private decision to surrender his life to Christ, and it started to show in his life. In a news article from the Springfield, Missouri News-Leader after his tragic death a friend said, "I think he became more settled; he could focus…" based on interviews with his family and fellow golfers, the newspaper reported: "Most everyone who knew or followed Payne Stewart noticed a difference in him the year before his death. The 42-year-old golfer who had once snapped at autograph seekers and berated reporters….had, it appeared, grown up." The article noted some theories about the change, crediting his wife and a public relations class, but then made a startling focus for a newspaper. "But the WWJD (What Would Jesus Do?) bracelet on Stewart's wrist became the telltale sign for almost everyone. Stewart had returned to the religious faith he learned about as a child, and everything else had fallen neatly into place."

You know, when we learn to lean into Jesus more and more, his life begins to show through us more and more. Not in a superficial way, but a more consistent, steady pattern of Christlikeness. It is not perfection, but it is the kind of life we were made for. One that begins to permeate our relationships with God, others, and ourselves. That is the fruit bearing kind of life we will be exploring in the Sunday's to come. Hope you will join us!

A Special Blessing Experienced and Told by Tracy Shore:

The alarm system was going bad on my Camry and Kye had to come to Winston to reset it a few weeks ago because the car will not crank if it has to be reset. We had someone at the Toyota place that was just going to completely take it off the car but had not confirmed a date for us to take it. I didn't drive it for a few days as Kye kept a look at it and would go out and crank it, so I started driving it again to work, like a dummy. Last Monday, my co-worker and I ran some errands at lunch, cranked just fine. I got ready to leave work and it would not start. I worked for about 15 minutes to reset the alarm before calling Kye, I am a Shore and just a little stubborn, I just knew I would be able to get it reset. I finally broke down and called him and he walked me through (again) how to reset it, nothing. I tried resetting it for 30 minutes, while he drove to Winston, nothing. Kye got to the office and he worked on it another 20 minutes trying to reset it, nothing. The man at the Toyota place said if we could get it cranked, just to bring it on over there and for us to try to unhook the battery cable from the battery for a few minutes and see if that would work. Nothing worked. We left it at the office. I was not being a very good Christian on the way home, because now we were going to have to get it towed 5 minutes down the road. I was so mad at myself for not taking it on over there. We left the battery unhooked overnight. I get to work on Tuesday morning and reconnected the battery cable to the battery and tried for about 20 minutes to reset the alarm, nothing. I unhooked the battery cable again and came inside and started working. Kye texted me and told me to just go ahead and call and get it towed. I told him I was going to try one more time before I gave up. I worked about 30 minutes and gathered the ladies that I work with and told them "Come on, we are going to go pray over my car, like in the Jesus Revolution movie" and out the door we went. Sandy said a prayer as we held hands. I reconnected the battery cable and got in the car and pushed the button to reset the alarm, like I had 100 times in the past 2 days, and the light stopped flashing and stayed red. I turned the key and it cranked. Cold chills ran over me. Why would God crank this car after I had acted so ugly the day before? I personally feel that He does the little things for us to show us that we can trust Him with the big things in our lives. Just keep praying.....


