Desperate Prayer

Years ago I had a conversation with Phil Hinerman, a Methodist pastor, whose spiritual life greatly influenced me. We talked about many things that day, and then I asked him about prayer. I was wondering if he knew of some good books on prayer that he would recommend to me. As I was waiting on his response, I was expecting some classic titles or newer volumes on communion with God that had given him the secret to spiritual growth. Almost immediately he gave me a surprising answer. He said, "I have not found any book on prayer that fully satisfies me." He went on to expound on a life of learning about prayer mainly from experience. It was a growing process that was continuing in his life deep into his 80's. He spoke of certain elements of his prayer practice such as gratitude, surrender, faith, intercession, and then more gratitude. He spoke of how important it was for him to pray daily with a specific time and place. He then added that he had learned to pray whether he felt like it or not. I left that conversation remembering one other statement he made to me.

"I have to pray to survive the day".

That last confession has stuck with me for over twenty years; I pray to survive. It is so easy to listen to sermons on prayer, or to deliver them, or read books on prayer, and talk about prayer...without ever praying, without having a real prayer life. My conversation with this elder saint reminded me that prayer should be studied, but more importantly it must be practiced. Prayer must become the great navigating tool of our lives. A sailor can chart his course by the stars at night. He can do this because the stars are fixed in the heavens. They are unchanging even if he is being tossed around by the waves of the sea. The Lord utilizes prayer in many ways, but he always uses it to keep our hearts and minds fixed on his unchanging character and grace in the midst of an unstable and often hostile world.

In the book, "Lead with Prayer", Ryan Skoog writes about a security guard that was assigned to protect Billy Graham early in his ministry. While at an auditorium this guard slipped out to check the alleyway. When he returned, he could not find the evangelist. "Oh no, I've lost Billy Graham!". While frantically searching backstage he heard a desperate, solitary voice. He found Graham on his face pleading in prayer, "God, I cannot do this without you! God, I need your strength and power to speak today." No crusade was planned that day. Billy Graham was preparing to speak to a midsize group of leaders for only fifteen minutes.

The most important contributions that prayer brings through our lives does not come from technique, but from tenacity. Not from perfection, but from persistence. Not just from duty, but from desperation. We don't need to be convinced of the value of prayer; we just need to pray.

We need to pray regularly, habitually, and expectantly.
