

Taking Our Thoughts Captive

Several weeks ago, I was loading some clothes in my van. It was dusk, and the interior light drew several different bugs in. The next day I got the insects out of the vehicle, or so I thought. When I later removed the clothes, I took out a suit and noticed a white speck on the shoulder of the jacket. I flicked it off, but it did not flick. I rubbed it, but it was still there. It was not a speck or lint; it was a hole. Two holes actually. One the size of a pinhead and the other twice that size. It was then I thought back to that dusky night when the insects flew in, and I remembered that one of them was a moth. That moth had stayed undetected and was quietly feasting on my suit.

The Bible sometimes speaks of our Christian life as a garment. Colossians 3:12 states: Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience...and beyond all these things put on love..". Consistently, what the New Testament conveys is that the spiritual outer garments of the Christian are the marks of Christlike living with others. We are clothed with the outward behavior that issues from our inward state with Christ.

These outer "clothes" are the expressions of Christ's heart within us that the church and the world can see.

But what if a damaging thought starts to eat away at that outward testimony. Sometimes something small slips into our mind or attitude that seems so insignificant that we ignore it. It could be the feeling that we have been slighted or mistreated by another. It could be a disposition that has rubbed off on us from a hostile and selfish world. In this day where negativity, fear, and anger are festering, it is easy for these attitudes to slowly begin to chew on the Christlike virtues that others can see. To me, that old moth represents the sometimes-random things that happen to us that are unpleasant and frustrating. Those experiences can begin to foster harmful thoughts about others that can affect how we relate to them. Suspicious and defensive thoughts can eat into our ability and willingness to be humble, kind, compassionate, and patient with others. I must say that this election cycle is giving us a lot to become negative about if we allow it to. What "eats" at us can become destructive and even irreparable to our relationships like that suit that could not be mended. It fits that the Hebrew word for moth is "ash" which means death.

One of the most potent deterrents to these "mothy" threats is gratitude. As we yield our thoughts, and focus our prayers, on God's graciousness in our lives, we find our loving expressions of Christlikeness kept intact and even expanding. This is why scripture teaches us to "take our thoughts captive". Grateful hearts are more immune to the slow nibble of a negative influence. If we keep focusing on the glorious privilege to be "God's chosen", who are "holy and dearly loved" we will not be diminished in our compassionate witness to the world. So, let's not let those harmful thoughts flutter into this glorious life we have in Christ!

At first, we did not really speak to each other. It was awkward, I am not going to lie.
