The Empathy of Christ

Many years ago, I talked with a seminary professor who taught comparative world religions at Rice University for nearly 30 years. He was a man who had studied all the major religions that capture the hearts of mankind, and had engaged in and watched numerous religious debates. In his experience he had found that Christianity stood apart from all the others. The belief that all religions are "streams flowing into the same great river" does not harmonize with the teachings of the New Testament, nor with a thoughtful comparison. Dr. Neilson mentioned that there was one subject during those debates that brought curiosity and even shock from others that practiced different religions. It was when the question of suffering arose.

There is no doubt that Christianity stands apart from other religions in many areas, but it is suffering that draws such a clear line of distinction. Why? It is because Christianity believes in a God who understands human suffering and disappointment from experience, not just divine understanding. He understands the cruelty and brutality of earthly living not merely because He is all-knowing, but because He has been there...or should I say He has been here.

When we read the book of Hebrews, I sometimes wonder how the writer must have felt as he was scratching out those inspired words. He was writing to people who had been Jews all their lives but had converted to Christianity. With their conversion came ridicule from their former friends, neighbors, and family. They were being abused and hounded to return to their Jewish roots. What do you write to a person who is going through such a time? Even today, what do you say to those who tread the deep waters of adversity? Consider the writer of Hebrews as he tells these suffering souls about the superiority of Jesus Christ and of His power and might. Of how he warns them of the consequences of falling away and encourages them to "run with perseverance the race marked out for them". But then witness the picture he paints on the canvass of their hearts that renders the greatest comfort: Jesus, their High Priest, has suffered and can personally identify with their struggles.

Think for just a moment about the life of Jesus. He knew the ridicule of a family who thought that he was mentally unstable. He felt the rejection coming from a once supportive multitude. He heard the murmuring of those who falsely accused Him and He bore the brunt of their verbal and physical blows. He watched with great anguish as His closest friends abandoned, denied, and betrayed Him. The kiss of Judas in the garden may have caused more pain than Pilate's scourging. The list could go on but the evidence is clear: Jesus suffered, and that is important.

Jesus sees all you encounter every day from the vantage point of heaven. He sees every difficult moment in your life. Yet no matter how well He can see us from glory, he never forgets his view of our pain from His experience on the cross, and He walks beside us through His Spirit every painful step.

God told Moses, "I have *heard* the cries of my people". His Son now says, "I can *feel* the cries of my followers". When it comes to understanding our sufferings, struggles, and adversities, God can not only hear...He can remember his own suffering in this world. Christ knows your pain!
