From Washed Up to Repurposed

Driftwood is weathered by the wind and the waves until eventually tossed aside on the beach. At first glance, driftwood seems like useless debris, but that couldn't be further from the truth. Driftwood is known for its texture, beauty, and character, and it is often used by artists to create magnificent sculptures.

We are God's driftwood. We all carry scars and brokenness. For some, life is going well, and they don't feel like driftwood right now. Carried by the Current
